A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

As I reflect on the period from July 2023 to June 2024, I am proud to share the achievements of The LBW Trust. With the generous support of our donors, the Trust supported 11 educational partners, 2660 students and 78 Australian country libraries.

Our October 2023 Annual Dinner at Doltone House in Sydney's CBD was a highlight, with attendees declaring it a most memorable evening. The T10 National Backyard Cricket (NBYC) Tournaments in Melbourne, Perth and Sydney continued to grow, raising over \$175,000 to further our mission of levelling the global playing field in education.

In September, a unique backyard cricket event at the Governor General's residence in Canberra brought together 480 children from 19 schools, six Afghan National Women's Cricket Team members, and many supporters. Organised with Cricket ACT and the Office of the Governor General, it celebrated the joy of cricket and the power of education.

This year, we farewelled two valued Board Members, Malcolm Alder and Penny Verdich, whose contributions were invaluable. We welcomed Tricia Ho-Hudson, Antony Karpin, Samantha Forbes and Michael Dalton to the Board, bringing new energy to our mission. Additionally, we strengthened our team with Kathryn Toohey as the Marketing and Communications lead and Alex Tynan-Davey as a dedicated Events Coordinator.

The Women for Change Committee had another exceptional year, hosting innovative events such as the Ignite Art Show at Sydney University and a Masterclass featuring Sam Mostyn who soon after was appointed Governor General of Australia. The committee helped women access tertiary education and job-ready programs in India, Nepal and Kenya.

I am deeply grateful to the Board, supporters, volunteers and partners for their dedication and contributions. Together, we continue to empower individuals through education, creating life-changing opportunities and stronger communities worldwide.

OUR IMPACT

In 2023-20244, we continued to support 11 Educational Partners across 7 countries. As a result, 1429 students received support for tertiary or vocational training, with additional 1230 attending skills training programs funded by LBW through our partners.

- funding university fees and housing for the most vulnerable, aspiring students in India and Sri Lanka;
- enabling students in Nepal to receive an education through undertaking their studies at a Plus 2 College;
- supporting Afghan refugees displaced in Indonesia to gain the skills to become volunteer teachers, able to teach refugee children while they and their families await the long process of resettlement; and
- transforming the lives of intern Teachers in Tanzania, supporting them as they gain practical classroom experience.



OUR EVENTS

Our **Annual Dinner** was held at Doltone House on Sydney's Hyde Park in October where 270 supporters of The LBW Trust community gathered to celebrate.

Sam Perry and Ian Higgins of The Grade Cricketer MC'd the evening with guests enjoying entertainment from Scott Finnie and Blake Bowden, Former Australian Test Cricketer and Coach Justin Langer and former Afghan cricketers, Benafsha Hashimi and Nilab Stanikzai.

Through the generosity of our supporters, the dinner raised over \$185,000 to educate students in developing nations, providing transformational opportunities to change these students' lives and the future of their communities.

NATIONAL BACKYARD CRICKET

Through our National Backyard Cricket (NBYC) program we continue to bring communities together around Australia. In September 2023, we partnered with Cricket ACT to bring together 480 ACT primary students from 19 schools to play *Games on the Greens* at the Governor General's residence in Canberra.

The event featured an impressive setup with 17 backyard cricket pitches, equipped with 102 stumps, 136 cones, 45 balls and 34 bats. Adding to the excitement, a cricket ball signed by Pat Cummins was also part of the experience, inspiring awe among the participants.





In February and March, the National Backyard Cricket Committee hosted highly successful T10 Corporate Cricket Tournaments in Melbourne, Sydney, and Perth. The three events raised over \$175,000 to support education for disadvantaged young adults.

We also proudly launched our Workplace Giving program during the tournaments, enabling employees to make direct contributions to The Trust from their wages.




NBYC COUNTRY LIBRARY GRANTS

In conjunction with our partners FOLA (Friends of Libraries Australia) and Harvey Norman, 78 grants were awarded to **Australian Country Libraries** to the value of \$110,126.

A vibrant country library is essential to strengthening rural communities and transforming them into hubs of learning for a better world.

NBYC funding supports programs like science fairs and cooking classes, educational tools such as robots, VR sets, and computers for learning. It also provides physical resources like books, furniture and hardware including iPads and tablets.



LEVEL UP LEADERSHIP CLASS

The Level Up Leadership Masterclass was a sell-out event and attracted 65 attendees and featured inspiring keynotes from Sam Mostyn AO and Kristin Stubbins AM (pictured here). Amanda MacLean, CEO of the Gravitas Project, led the highly interactive 'Mastering Influence and Impact' skills development workshop.

With practical demonstrations, live coaching, real career stories, and a panel of Australia's leading business women, the Masterclass was all about developing women to be confident leaders.



THE IGNITE ART EVENT

Women for Change also hosted an inaugural Art Show in February 2024 at the Sibyl Centre, The Women's College at The University of Sydney.

The event was a tremendous success with over 500 attendees to support young women in India, Nepal and Kenya. A number of well-known artists donated works to IGNITE, along with many other emerging artists. A special exhibition of artwork created by inmates in NSW Correctional Centres was also shown.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS ACROSS WFC PROJECTS

Kakenya's Dream I Maasai Mara, Kenya

WFC supports one new undergraduate scholarship student to study in Sydney annually to continue the strong relationship with Kakenya's Dream.

Four young women continued their various studies in FY24 and continue to be visible role models and influencers in their community.



SPRJ Kanyashala Trust | Mumbai, India

In FY24 WFC created, sponsored and delivered a "key talent" program alongside our Mumbai partner, SPRJ Kanyashala Trust. 25 young women have not only received tuition fees but have also been supported to attend tailored programs to develop computer skills, English language and improvement personal development (including presentation and interview skills).

WFC volunteers have helped mentor these young women as they compete for internships and graduate roles in a highly competitive environment.



Heartland Centre for Women | Kathmandu, Nepal

In 2024 a new tertiary college and health clinic for women opened in Kathmandu with the support of Women For Change.

The college is changing the lives of not only young women, but women of all ages, by creating a safe environment for health care consultations, including cervical cancer screening.



Teach Her | India and Nepal

In partnership with John Marshall via Teach Her and The S Group (Tasmania), WFC continued to support young women from Indian orphanages to access tertiary education.





The success of recent events and initiatives serves as a strong foundation, propelling The LBW Trust toward a future where its influence in promoting education and equal opportunities will continue to flourish.


FINANCIALS
